

Halcyonia Monthly Meeting, Book D 1969-1982

Archives: This minute book is held by the Canadian Quaker Archives and Library in Newmarket, Ontario in Box 101 (S-101-4).

[Fritchley Meeting](#) is in Fritchley, Derbyshire, England and is still an active meeting. Several Fritchley Quakers established Halcyonia Meeting in Borden, Saskatchewan in 1903. They were part of a western group of meetings in Alberta and British Columbia that met annually. The Halcyonia Meeting is now named the [Borden Meeting of Conservative Friends](#) and remains an active [conservative](#) meeting. Jane Zavitz Bond states that the meeting had an association with the Ohio Yearly Meeting. She adds that the first minute book, Book A, has been lost.

Hugh & Margaret Wake's daughter who remained in England with her husband at the
time the rest of the family came to Canada in 1913

A copy of the third minute from the minutes of Fritchley Preparative Meeting held at
Fritchley on the 2nd 2nd 1969.

We have sorrowfully to record the death of Elizabeth Darbyshire which took place in
hospital on the 26th 1st month 1969 at the age of 78 after a long period of failing health
which she bore with much patience and courage.

She was a daughter of Jesse & Elizabeth Darbyshire and a birthright member of Fritchley
Meeting. She spent most of her life in the village and was a faithful attender of Meetings
for Worship and for several years, Clerk to Fritchley Monthly Meeting.

Throughout her life she used the plain language and exhibited a consistent disregard for all
forms of ostentation.

She held her beliefs sincerely and, we feel, was careful to live in that measure of light
which was hers.

The interment took place at Crich burial ground following a Meeting for Worship at
Fritchley Friends Meeting House. Sincere tributes were paid to our Friend in the Meeting
and by members of the nursing staff of the hospital who made us feel that

it had been a privilege to nurse her. Her presence amongst us will be greatly missed.

It is with a deep sense of loss that we record the death on Feb 9th of Lydia Tomes at the age of 89.

Lydia Tomes' family has a long connection with Friends her paternal grandfather being the noted antiquarian Henry Thomas Wake who joined the Meeting in 1882 & had a considerable influence amongst Friends in this area.

She was the daughter of Hugh & Margaret Wake, who; until emigrating to Canada early this century; were members of this Meeting. Lydia remained in this country with her husband Alfred Tomes who had joined Fritchley Meeting as a convinced Friend.

From childhood the Meeting was at the centre of her life. One of her early memories was of being marched, with the rest of the children from the small Friends private school to the site of the present Meeting House, where each pupil laid a foundation brick.

She was ever faithful in attending Meetings for Worship & ever ready to do any good work for the Meeting that lay in her power.

Gentle & unassuming she did not speak much about her faith, she just lived it, this & her sunny smile endeared her to all who knew her well.

Although her life was often tempest tossed, she retained into old age her joy in gardening, in beauty & above all in friendship, & many, both young and old, Friends and non Friends, have expressed their deep feelings of sorrow & bereavement at her passing. We feel her life was an example to us all.

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HALCYONIA MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS Held at Thistledale
Meeting House 24th of 4th Month 1969.

1st Minute: The finance committee brought forward a statement of expences of material, for repairs and re-decorating of the Meeting House.

2nd Minute: The Meeting is agreed for each member household to pay 25.00 to enable full payment of expenses,

– Also covering our quota for Yearly Meeting leaving any balance in the treasury.

3rd Minute: This Meeting has four newly appointed Trustees, Whom are, Cornelius Penner, Betty Penner, Ruth Bergman, Allen Penner and Philip McCheane (Philip being added later).

4th Minute: The question of our present relationship to Canadian Yearly Meeting has been under consideration by the Meeting. After some discussion the Clerk has been instructed to send the following letters – One to Canadian Y. Meeting and one to Norwich M. Meeting. Also ~~and~~ a copy to be appended to the Minutes.

5th Minute: Proposed that the date of our next M. Meeting be left open, date & time to be announced.

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HALCYONIA MEETING FOR BUSINESS Held at Thistledale Meeting House 9th of 6th Mo. 1978.

1st Minute: The question of appointing a new registra to take the place of our Friend Joshua K. Wake, who has held the position for many years. (He is now 92 years)

2nd Minute: The Clerke is requested to gather together names and dates of those of our members whos deaths have not been recorded.

3rd Minute: The minutes of our last Meeting have been read

4th Minute: William Wake has accepted the Office as Secretary & treasurer for the Meeting.

5th Minute: Payment is made from time to time to those of the Penner family for work done in keeping the Meeting House & grounds in good order.

6th Minute: The Meeting approved the agreement that each Member give 20.00 towards the upkeep of the Meeting House funds

7th Minute: Margaret Saunders has expressed the wish to be freed of the position as Clerk of the Meeting. Neil Penner name was suggested & the Meeting approved his acceptance.

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8th Minute: The Meeting has appointed the Trustees to go ahead with the purchasing of 20 more chairs to take the place of those stolen from the Meeting House Also make enquires towards purchasing another book-case to replace the one also stolen.

9th Minute: The Meeting has authorized the newly appointed Clerk Neil Penner and William Wake to enquire into the matter that would make it legal for them to sign cheques for the business of the Meeting.

10th Minute: Meetings for Worship are held regularly at the Thistledale Meeting House through the Summer months, and in Friends home during the Winter.

11th Minute: Time and place for our next business Meeting will be announced.

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Fourth Day 2 p.m. 5th Month 13th 1981

1st Minute: Meeting was opened with a short period of Quiet.

2nd Minute: Minutes of the Last Monthly Meeting were read

3rd Minute: Chairs had been purchased by W.O. Wake to replace the stolen ones. Money was used from the Meeting House expense fund.

4th Minute: Margaret Saunders has a list of deaths to record when it is fully prepared. These are Quaker families.

5th Minute: For the present the Secretary will assume position of Registrar.

6th Minute: We will accept another round of donations for Meeting House Fund etc. \$20 per adult member was decided on.

7th Minute: A new official trustee was appointed for the Meeting house & grounds Al Penner.

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8th Minute: Things that require care at this time on the Meeting House & yard.

1. Repair Steps
2. Mow Yard carefully & around the driveway
3. Affix board over doorway below the swallows nest
4. Check condition of Sign (needs painting)
5. General Check up of Meeting House
6. Windows to be repaired by Philip M.
7. Tin piece for Heater Stand
8. Runner mat for meeting House
9. Firewood
10. Sand & varnish window sills and table

11. Polish Stove

9th Minute: Payment to be made to persons doing maintenance work.

10th Minute: Next Monthly Meeting to be called by the Clerk.

Billy -

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First Day, 2 p.m. 10th Mo. 31st 1982

1st Minute: Meeting was opened with a “quiet time”.

2nd Minute: Minutes of the last Meeting were read.

3rd Minute: Al Penner and Gerald Bergmann were appointed to check out and repair, windows, sills, and doorway of meeting house, next spring.

4th Minute: A concern about title of the meeting house land was expressed. Note to check this out when we are in the vicinity of the land office.

5th Minute: Dave Penner was nominated for registrar. To be registered in Regina before Nov 18 - 1982 (11th Mo.)

6th Minute: The registrar or clerk will keep record of deaths & births.

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7th Minute: Clerkship to be taken over by Allen Penner.

8th Minute: It was decided to have Neil Penner continue as treasurer, assisted by Joan Penner.
