## Lobo (Coldstream) Preparative Meeting Minutes. 1912 - 1938

This minute book is held by the Canadian Quaker Archives and Library in Newmarket, Ontario. It was microfilmed in 1974 and the film can be seen at the Archives of Ontario, MS 303, reel 35.

The transcription was coordinated by Jane Zavitz Bond, archivist for Canada Yearly Meeting, and fully transcribed by Sheila Havard with minor formatting changes for posting by Randy Saylor. The text was transcribed as written so researchers must consider the many variations in spelling when searching the transcribed text. Minor paragraphing has been done to enhance readability. Transcriber notes are in square brackets. The book has not been proof read.

This transcription is donated to the Canadian Friends Historical Association (CFHA). It is made freely available and supports search, cut and paste. CFHA will officially grant linking privileges to organizations that support this free access. CFHA wishes to express its gratitude to those who worked on this project.

Lobo Township is in Middlesex County and situated a few miles west of London, Ontario. The township was settled around 1834 in part by Quakers from the Pelham area and directly from Pennsylvania. In 1849 the growing Quaker community was granted indulged status by Norwich Monthly Meeting. In 1850 the first meeting house was built. Soon the meeting house was no longer adequate and was replaced by the current brick meeting house in 1859 at the small village of Coldstream. In 1857 the meeting became a Preparative Meeting under Norwich Monthly Meeting. Arthur Dorland in his *A History of the Society of Friends (Quakers) in Canada*, 1927 & 1968, states that Lobo Meeting became one of the most progressive centres of the Hicksite Branch of Friends in Canada [172]. In the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1930 it was decided to continue the prep meetings but only twice a year.

In 1893, since Lobo was the most active meeting within the Monthly Meeting it was decided that the name of Norwich Monthly Meeting should be changed to Lobo Monthly Meeting [Dorland, 172]. According to Jane Zavitz Bond, in the 1980's Lobo Monthly Meeting became Coldstream Monthly Meeting and Yarmouth was set off as Yarmouth Monthly Meeting at Sparta. Coldstream is still an active meeting and Coldstream Friends Meeting has a website at coldstreamquakers.com.

## F.D. School report.

The F.D. School Committee submit the following report. –

The committee to have charge of the First-Day School for the past year present the following report to the Preparative Meeting held 4<sup>th</sup> of 12<sup>th</sup> mo. 1912.

The school was divided into seven classes, the two Infant Classes taking the lessons found in the "Scattered Seeds" the remaining five taking the "Ethical Lessons from the New Testament" prepared by Friends At the end of the first quarter we could not secure the second quarter so changed to the "Graded Course" Topics selected from the International Series. The teachers take their turn in reviewing the lessons one each week.

We have distributed "What to Do" and the Mayflower to the four younger classes both are weekly papers and the two infant classes have the "Scattered Seeds"

The interest in our School the past year is very encouraging. We have had a total enrolment of 85 with an average attendance of nearly 53 – the largest for several years back. The highest number at school one day was 66 and the lowest 40. This is not counting four very interesting sessions on Philanthropic work, one at the end of each quarter.

We have secured books to the value of \$7.20 which we feel will quite renew the Library. Mention must be made here of a gift from a Friend of \$2.00 for the Library books, which was much appreciated. Some effort was made to start a home department but no definite work was accomplished.

We held our usual enjoyable picnic on the Meeting house grounds, it seemed a time that was looked forward to by both old and young as the event of the summer about 130 attended.

After a very encouraging year we recommend that the school be carried on under the care of a committee for the coming year.

We held our Annual enjoyable Picnic on the meeting house grounds which was well attended about 140 being present.

After a very encouraging year we recommend that the school be carried on under the care of a committee for the coming year.
