1938 - 1942

Archives: This minute book is held by the Canadian Quaker Archives and Library in Newmarket, Ontario. It is stored in Box 41, item 4. The fonds is also described as O-41-item with the O standing for Orthodox.

Botsford St Friends Church in Newmarket was also called Yonge St Meeting and Newmarket Meeting. In 1881, the Orthodox Canada Yearly Meeting separated into Evangelical (church service) and Conservative (silent worship) branches. At Yonge St, the Conservative branch maintained the original 1812 Meeting House and were designated Yonge St Conservative. The Botsford St Friends Church was designated Yonge St Orthodox with an Evangelical church service and they were the other part of the separation establishing their church in Newmarket. The Church Friends received the burying ground on Yonge St. Both monthly meetings were named Yonge Street Monthly Meeting, claiming legal and theological continuation to the original meeting body.

This Monthly Meeting book was deposited along with all the Botsford St. Mtg. minute books in the CYM Archives in the early 1980's, by Marjorie Moore Keffer, clerk at the time, when the Botsford St meeting was laid down. Box 41 was created at that time. It was microfilmed, with other Botsford St records, but not part of the 1975 microfilming.
