INTRODUCTION

The Archives of the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) in Canada have been microfilmed by the Ontario Archives at the request of the Canadian Friends Historical Association. The Archives is pleased to have produced this film record both to ensure the preservation of the originals and to facilitate its scholarly use.

The originals remain the property of the Canadian Yearly Meeting of Friends and are on loan deposit in the library of the University of Western Ontario.

Because the original records have been cited according to a preliminary inventory prepared at the University $c_{i}^{(i)}$ Western Ontario, these reference numbers have been included in this Inventory in brackets beside their corresponding Archives of Ontario microfilm entry for the use of researcheze who may wish to correlate published references to the microfilm and to the originals. In the U.W.O. reference, <u>C</u> identifies records of Conservative Friends, <u>O</u> identifies Orthodox records, and <u>H</u> identifies Genessee (Hicksite) records.
