# ASSOCIATION'S HISTORICAL BUS TOUR AT NIAGARA AUGUST 17, 1973

The first annual tour of the Canadian Friends Historical Association was undertaken following the business meeting held in conjunction with the Canadian Yearly Meeting of Friends, which in 1973 was held at Niagara Christian College, Fort Erie, in Ontario.

It was thought that the region presented a splendid opportunity to follow the path - at least in part - of Joseph Lindley, an early Friend visiting the area from Philadelphia. Accordingly, we proceeded to visit as many of the settlements mentioned in his journal as time permitted.

Our first stop was at Fort Erie at what we feel was the Canadian terminal of the ferry which in those days was the mode of transport across the broad Niagara River, the boundary at this point.

Our next stop was the Friends Burying Ground at Ridgeway - all that is left in this small town to remind one of the flourishing and influential Friends Meeting held here in the early days of the settlement of this County in pioneer times. The Memorial stones in this burying ground bear the surnames of Friends active in the Society and as the stones are of the Quaker "low style" we were able to see C.Harold Zavitz head to the ground before a stone, deciphering the name of an ancestor. Before we left this quiet spot a descendant of Asa Schooley, one of the first members of this Meeting, read an original poem by Bertha Pound describing her thoughts while in the Quaker meeting held here.

Time was passing and we hurried on to the Friends Brick Church at Pelham Corners. This building was erected in 1865 to accommodate the Orthodox branch of the Society following the Separation in 1827. The building has undergone several changes. Originally designed, I am told with facing seats for the ministers



and elders, a platform pulpit and organ was installed following the Gurneyite schism, during which many Orthodox groups divided into "Conservative" and "Progressive" Friends.

In 1956 when most Friends in Canada united to form the Canadian Yearly Meeting, members of the Pelham Friends Church decided they could not co-operate and are now part of the Evangelical Friends Church (Eastern Region) with head-quarters at Damascus, Ohio. Here at the "Brick" the tour members were cordially welcomed and a table was spread in their social room on the ground floor of a building, moved over from Effingham in the "Short Hills" where it had been built by Friends in 1878. This structure has been joined to the "Brick" and developed into a social hall and Sunday school on two levels. Here we were served coffee and cakes by faithful members of the Ladies Aid of the Pelham Friends Church.

We had time before sunset to visit the old Friends Cemetery and grounds, the site of the first meeting house in the Niagara area. Here the first Monthly meeting in Canada was established on the 2nd of 10th month, 1799, consisting of Pelham and Black Creek Preparative Meetings. These Preparative Meetings were set off the previous day by a committee of the Philadelphia Yearly Meeting of Friends. The White Meeting House which was the last of three built on this was sold in 1928 to the Fenwick Womens! Institute and moved to the village of Fenwick. Our final stop was to see this building. After many years of service to the community as a social centre it is now closed. We found it interesting to imagine the building at its original site, and to place ourselves within its walls.

It was too late to follow further the steps the horse of Joseph Lindley had trod. Lindley had travelled 82 more miles than we had by bus.

Special appreciation is expressed to Esther Summers of Fonthill, Ontario, and Audrey Laurie of St.Catharines. Audrey Laurie is a descendant of Asa Schooley. Both were valuable resource people and provided a lively commentary during the trip.

Ed Phelps, Regional History Librarian, University of Western Ontario, and Curator of the Quaker Collection, was also present during the trip and was able to contribute to the success of the bus tour.
